MAYOR DE VITA called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. with the Pledge of Allegiance.

PUBLIC HEARING ON INTRODUCTORY LOCAL LAW H-2020, RENTAL REGISTRATION

At 6:09 pm, Mayor DeVita opened the public hearing with a discussion of Introductory Local Law H-2020 (proposed Local Law 8-2020), concerning a new Chapter 100 of the Village Code entitled Rental Registration.

The following Exhibits are appended to and made a part of these minutes:

- Affidavit from Elizabeth Kaye stating that the legal notice was posted at the Village Hall on Sept. 18, 2020
- Affidavit from the Oyster Bay Guardian showing that notice of the public hearing was published on Sept. 25, 2020
- Email from the Village Clerk to the Mayor and Board of Trustees sent on Oct. 5, 2020, with local law in final form attached
- Confirmation that the Notice of Public Hearing was published to the Village of Laurel Hollow website on Sept. 18, 2020
- Confirmation that the Notice of Public Hearing was sent to NEWS subscribers on Oct. 7, 2020
- Letter from the Nassau County Planning Commission, dated Sept. 30, 2020, stating that the local law is referred to the Village to take action as deemed appropriate.

Mayor DeVita described two instances in which squatters inhabited vacant homes, prompting the Board to propose this legislation which requires any Village homeowner who rents their home to register such rental with the Village. The law requires that a homeowner complete a registration form identifying the tenant(s), provide a copy of the rental agreement, and provide contact information for the absent homeowner. The law also requires real estate brokers who earn a commission on a rental to provide the registration information if the homeowner has not done so. Failure to comply can result in the issuance of summonses returnable in the Village Court and in

the imposition of fines. Board members asked how residents' and tenants' personal information will be protected and how residents will find out about the law. Mayor DeVita indicated that residents' and tenants' personal information is exempt from Freedom of Information Law requests and will be kept confidential. The Mayor further indicated that he will inform residents of the new law via Swiftreach and by letter. There being no further questions, the Mayor moved to close the public hearing at 6:25 pm, seconded by Deputy Mayor Nemshin, and approved upon the following poll of the Board:

BUILDING REPORT

DeMartin, 1532 Laurel Hollow Rd, Fill Permit Application # F4-2020- The Board considered a permit application to maintain 90 yards of wood chips in the front of the property. Mayor DeVita commented that run-off would have to be controlled with hay bales. Village Engineer Antonelli indicated that a utility pole would have to be moved to accommodate the proposed driveway onto Springwood Path. Mr. Rant, P.E. indicated he would move the driveway up-slope away from the pole so that the pole will not have to be moved. Village Attorney Avrutine indicated that this matter is a Type II action under SEQRA, and no further environmental review is required. Having reached out to two local contractors, Joe Grace and Frank Suppa, the Board considered price and availability and determined that because time was of the essence because of the potential for bad weather, Mayor DeVita moved to contract with Frank Suppa Landscaping at \$3500.00/day, with five workers to be done right away, rather than Joe Grace Landscaping at \$2500.00/day, with three
