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1	MR. AVRUTINE: The next public hearing is
2	Introductory Local Law D-2020, proposed amendment to
3	Chapter 10 of the Village Code regarding service of
4	appearance tickets.
5	The exhibits in connection with this public
6	hearing are as follows:
7	First, the Affidavit of Publication from the
8	North Shore Leader that the legal advertisement was
9	published on February 26, 2020.
10	The next exhibit is an affidavit from
11	Elizabeth Kaye that the legal notice was posted at
12	Village Hall on February 21, 2020.
13	The next exhibit is an e-mail from the Village
14	Clerk to the Mayor and the Board of Trustees sent on
15	February 28, 2020, with the local law in final form
16	attached.
17	The next exhibit is confirmation that the
18	Notice of Public Hearing was published to the Village of
19	Laurel Hollow website on February 19, 2020.
20	The next exhibit is confirmation that the
21	Notice of Public Hearing was sent to Village website
22	NEWS subscribers on March 4, 2020.
23	And the final exhibit is a letter from the
24	Nassau County Planning Commission dated February 27,
25	2020, that the local law is referred to the Village to

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take action as it deems appropriate.

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This local law expands the manner in which appearance tickets must be served. Previously, the Code limited it to personal service meaning that it had to be personally delivered to, if it was an individual, the individual, if it was an entity, whatever -- that's really not changing because you can serve an entity in multiple ways and that hasn't changed. But the personal delivery for the natural person did limit the ability to serve some people, especially those who were seeking to evade being served.

12 So with change in the statute which went into 13 effect on January 1, the locality, such as villages, 14 were authorized to expand the manner in which appearance 15 tickets may be served. So what this local law purports 16 to do is, in accordance with that change that I just 17 mentioned, an appearance ticket can be served in any 18 manner that a summons may be served under the New York Civil Practice Law and Rules which includes personal 19 20 delivery as we've been speaking about but other methods 21 such as serving an adult person at the person's 22 residence and similar things, more options for the code 23 enforcement officer to make service. But that is 24 limited to violations of building matters, zoning 25 matters, and issues regarding refuse. So that's the

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1	reference to the chapters under which this type of	
2	service can be effectuated.	
3	So as I have indicated, it expands the ability	
4	to effectuate service and make it easier for our code	
5	enforcer.	
6	MAYOR DE VITA: I think Howard said it all.	
7	So, does anybody have any other comments from
