1 MAYOR DE VITA: The next matter is 2 our Public Hearing. MR. AVRUTINE: This is case 3 F1-2016, the Public Hearing on the 4 5 application of Christine E. Diefendorf 6 to regrade a portion of the rear yard of 12 Waylor Lane, Laurel Hollow. 8 original application proposed the relocation of approximately 408 cubic yards of material. An updated 10 11 application received by the Village on 12 February 21, 2017 and based upon the 13 plans of Nicholas DeSantis, PE dated February 20, 2017 last revised on 14 15 3/10/2017, depicts the relocation of 16 approximately 250 cubic yards of material, as well as installation of 17 18 drainage. 19 This property is also known as 20 Section 25 Block 48 Lot 12 on the Land 2.1 and Tax Map of Nassau County. 22 The exhibits in connection with 23 this hearing are as follows: 24 First, Notification from the Nassau 2.5 County Planning Commission dated April

14, 2017 that the matter is referred to 1 2 the Laurel Hollow Board of Trustees for action as it deems appropriate. 3 The next exhibit is an undated 4 5 application with site grading and 6 drainage plan prepared by Nicholas 7 DeSantis, PE, dated 2/20/2017, last 8 revised 3/10/2017. The next exhibit is the Legal 10 Notice dated April 10, 2017. 11 The next exhibit is an Affidavit of 12 Posting from Nicholas Porcaro that the 13 Legal Notice was posted conspicuously on the Village Hall bulletin board on April 14 15 28, 2017. 16 The next exhibit is an Affidavit of Publication from James Slater that the 17 18 Legal notice was published in the Oyster 19 Bay Guardian on April 28, 2017. 20 The next exhibit is a document that 2.1 confirms that the Legal Notice was 22 published on the Village website and 23 sent to Village website subscribers on 24 April 27, 2017.

The next exhibit is an Affidavit

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1 from the Deputy Clerk stating that the Legal Notice was mailed to the 2 individuals set forth on the attached 3 list on April 27, 2017. 4 5 The next exhibit is an Affidavit of 6 Mailing from the applicant indicating 7 that the Notice of Public Hearing was mailed on April 17, 2017 to the 8 individuals set forth in the affidavit. The next exhibit is an excerpt from the 10 11 draft minutes of the Laurel Hollow 12 Planning Board meeting held on January 13 31, 2017 regarding the Diefendorf tree removal application. 14 The final exhibit is a revised New 15 16 Planting Plan and Tree Removal Plan 17 submitted to the Planning Board on 18 January 6, 2017. 19 Sir, please give us your name. 20 MR. DIEFENDORF: Monroe 2.1 Diefendorf, husband of Christine, 12 22 Waylor Lane. 23 So I think you have all seen the 24 plans that were done by Nick DeSantis. 2.5 As far as I know, they comply with all

1 of the regulations and drainage, and, 2 hopefully, Jim will verify it. I did send along, just for the 3 records, and if you don't have it I will 4 5 submit it again, just what trees are 6 being planted. We're removing, as part 7 of the prior, we're removing 10 trees 8 and planting 12 new trees, according to the arborist's recommendations. And, as 10 according to this map, I also have 11 pictures that were taken looking in all 12 directions from the yard of what the 13 slopes would be, you may have seen that. 14 So with, virtually, I don't think, any 15 implications to any of the neighbors. 16 So those are available if you need them. 17 MR. AVRUTINE: Mr. Diefendorf, were 18 those photographs already submitted? MR. DIEFENDORF: I sent them to 19 20 Nancy, I don't know if she --2.1 MR. AVRUTINE: I just want to make 22 sure they were part of the record. 23 MR. DIEFENDORF: Okay. 24 MR. AVRUTINE: Thank you. 2.5 MAYOR DE VITA: Just to clarify,

1 Mr. Diefendorf's application for the 2 tree removals was approved by the Planning Board with certain concerns, 3 including, I think the Planning Board 5 added two more trees. One of them was 6 conditioned on the approval of the slope permit by the Board of Trustees. Mr. Diefendorf is here for, 8 specifically, the fill permit which 10 involves drainage. 11 So, I know, Jim, you were out 12 there, you've seen the plan to put the 13 dry wells there towards the back. Trustee Miritello, Trustee Nicklas and I 14 15 were there yesterday, saw the property, 16 the way it kind of slopes down toward 17 the back. 18 In your opinion, is the plan 19 drainage sufficient for the changes in 20 the landscape of the topography to be 2.1 made? 22 MR. ANTONELLI: For the record, Jim 23 Antonelli, Village Engineer. 24 Well, let me answer that --2.5 MAYOR DE VITA: I did note in your

1	e-mail I am sorry to interrupt you
2	did say there may have to be some
3	placement changes made on site at the
4	time of the work being done.
5	MR. ANTONELLI: Right. The plan
6	that we have does meet the Village
7	standards.
8	If I can back up for just a second,
9	I want to clarify the plan that I have
10	is actually dated 2/20, February 20th.
11	It's date stamped by the Village March
12	10th. There is no revision date on the
13	plan that says March 10th, that I am
14	aware of. So just to correct the record
15	there's one date stamp, sometimes that
16	happens if the revision date was not put
17	on here, but it's the one that is date
18	stamped by the Village 3/10, not
19	actually revised by the engineer 3/10.
20	MR. AVRUTINE: There are two
21	sheets.
22	MR. ANTONELLI: Correct.
23	MR. AVRUTINE: C.100.00, and
24	C.101.00.
25	MR. ANTONELLI: Correct.

1 MR. AVRUTINE: Both dated 2/20/17, 2 both stamped as received March 10, 2017. MR. ANTONELLI: Correct. 3 4 TRUSTEE NICKLAS: Are the dry wells 5 on there, Jim? 6 MR. ANTONELLI: Yes. That was the 7 one where the plan was updated to show 8 some type of a drainage system, because I believe the previous plan showed 10 nothing and said that they tried to make 11 a case that the soils were permeable 12 enough to waive that, that's their 13 words, not mine. TRUSTEE MIRITELLO: 14 Who? 15 MR. ANTONELLI: The applicants, the 16 applicants' consultant. 17 MAYOR DE VITA: It's on the plan 18 now? 19 MR. ANTONELLI: Yes. The plan 20 that we have indicates tree removal, 2.1 grading of the rear yard, and a drainage 22 system. And the reason why I made my 23 memo with that note is, as we know, some 24 of these plans are -- I think all plans 2.5 are generalized to a point. And I just

1	want to make sure that in the field, and
2	I'm sure that Mike will ensure this with
3	any oversight, that the dry well is put
4	in the low spot and it's graded toward
5	it. And not taking the plan
6	literally, and if it doesn't quite fit
7	the actual topo that is out there, I
8	just wanted to make sure that was done.
9	Because it does look like there is a
10	very convenient spot for it and that's
11	where it should go.
12	TRUSTEE MIRITELLO: Where does the
13	water go now?
14	MR. ANTONELLI: Basically runs off
15	to the southwest, I believe.
16	TRUSTEE MIRITELLO: Won't go that
17	way anymore?
18	MR. ANTONELLI: No, it's going to
19	continue to go to the
20	TRUSTEE MIRITELLO: Drainage is
21	part of New York State Law, or the
22	requirement of drainage, was that part
23	of New York State Law.
24	MR. ANTONELLI: No. The Village
25	has an ordinance that requires a certain

1 amount of -- a certain design storm that 2 the drainage system should be designed for, actually, it's a minimum. I can 3 always require more, and I use my 5 judgment for that. 6 TRUSTEE MIRITELLO: New 7 construction? 8 MR. ANTONELLI: Yes, yes, in general. 10 TRUSTEE MIRITELLO: Most people 11 don't have these right now, most people 12 don't have these drains on their 13 property, or... MR. ANTONELLI: Just in the rear 14 15 yard, probably not. Anybody that has 16 done anything in the last 20-plus years, I think has. 17 18 TRUSTEE NICKLAS: We were out there 19 and both Jeff and I, I think I can speak 20 for you on this, both were like why do 2.1 we need a dry well on a lawn. Are you 22 really going to have runoff once that's 23 graded and permeable material is there 24 and grass is there? Are you going to 2.5 have a drainage problem?

1	MR. ANTONELLI: Absolutely.
2	TRUSTEE MIRITELLO: What will
3	change?
4	MR. ANTONELLI: Well, they're
5	regrading, so it's disturbing the soil.
6	TRUSTEE MIRITELLO: Still going out
7	at the same spot, exiting this property
8	at the same spot?
9	MR. ANTONELLI: The actual
10	calculation for the amount of storage is
11	based on the type of coverage, so it's a
12	percentage. So you would not, for
13	example, if you were to do a parking lot
14	or something that is paved and
15	impermeable, an impervious surface would
16	have a certain runoff coefficient of
17	probably 100 percent, where this is more
18	like one-third.
19	TRUSTEE MIRITELLO: So it's
20	changed.
21	MR. ANTONELLI: Yes.
22	TRUSTEE MIRITELLO: So the lawn,
23	it's no longer the same kind of
24	drainage.
25	MR. ANTONELLI: Correct, correct.

1	There is an entire science behind the
2	hydrology part of it.
3	MAYOR DE VITA: Is there anything
4	else from the Board?
5	TRUSTEE NICKLAS: Why are they so
6	close? On the plan, they seem to be
7	fairly close together.
8	MR. ANTONELLI: What?
9	MAYOR DE VITA: The dry wells.
10	TRUSTEE NICKLAS: They don't seem
11	to be spread out. Why do you need two,
12	instead of one big one, that looks like
13	there are two fairly close.
14	MR. ANTONELLI: There the runoff
15	goes to one area and they need, whatever
16	the capacity is they need, is split up
17	that way.
18	TRUSTEE MIRITELLO: So based on
19	your formula these are necessary.
20	MR. ANTONELLI: Yes. But in all
21	honesty, if they are excavating and feel
22	like they can get the adequate capacity,
23	or the same capacity with one dry well,
24	maybe in greater diameter. They come in
25	standard sizes of 8, 10 and 12 feet in

1	diameter, then it's possible that it can
2	work within one. So some of these
3	things are
4	TRUSTEE MIRITELLO: Is it possible,
5	can he change that in the field?
6	MAYOR DE VITA: Then you have to
7	order a new dry well.
8	MR. ANTONELLI: As long as the
9	Village agrees.
10	MR. McNERNEY: You've got to get
11	your design professional
12	Michael McNerney, Building
13	Inspector.
14	TRUSTEE MIRITELLO: Should we make
15	a motion?
16	MAYOR DE VITA: We all can't talk
17	at once. Go ahead, do you have another
18	question?
19	TRUSTEE MIRITELLO: I have no
20	questions.
21	TRUSTEE NICKLAS: No questions.
22	MAYOR DE VITA: Do any of the Board
23	members?
24	(No response.)
25	Does anybody in the audience have

1	any questions or comments?
2	(No response.)

And knowing what those are, I completed Part 2 of the 10 11 assessment form, which is the Village's 12 part where you try to assess where there 13 would be no or a small impact, or 14 whether it may be a large impact
