This Thursday January 6, 2022 at 6:30pm, the Village will conduct a Special Meeting (via Zoom) on a proposed construction project at the Cold Spring Harbor Lab, which will include 4 new research laboratory buildings, 2 scientist housing buildings, and a surface/subsurface parking garage, all to be located in the present-day upper campus parking area. Because of widespread COVID-19 infections, as of this afternoon our Village Hall is once again closed to public access.
