Subject: Vehicle Thefts in Daytime

Dear Neighbor:

There have been several attempts and actual thefts in North Shore villages in the past few days. In Laurel Hollow, an attempted vehicle theft occurred at 8:30 in the morning last week. These same criminals had eluded police in a nearby village where they also tried to steal a vehicle. Yesterday there was a theft at 3:00 in the afternoon in a nearby village and an attempt in another different village at 3:30pm. The criminals have become more brazen as fear of incarceration for these types of crimes has disappeared. Nevertheless, there are steps we can take to stop these crimes of opportunity. First, remove your wallets, purses, and other valuables from your vehicle and lock it. To repeat, lock your vehicle and take the key fob. Next, call 911--that's 911 and not the Village Hall or the police booth--to report any suspicious vehicles, persons, or activity any time of day. Remember, there is no parking on Village streets any time of day. Any vehicle parked on Village streets other than a contractor or vehicles parked with permission under a parking waiver (the police have a record of parking waiver requests) should be considered suspicious. Thank you for your vigilance and continued cooperation.
